Parts of Book and Website Citations

Author – person who wrote the book/article

Title – name of the book/article

Place of Publication – place where the book/article is published

Publisher - company that publishes the book/article

Copyright Date – year the book/article is published

URL – Universal Resource Locator – website address

Date of Access – the date YOU accessed the web article

Nonfiction Books in the Library

- Nonfiction books in the library are shelved by **order number** according to the **Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) System**.

- Example:

510.9 SMI

- Nonfiction books are shelved from the **lowest number** to the **highest number**.

- Example:

302.4 BAN

410.5 ARN

745.3 TOR

856.2 CAN

950.2 PER

Important Reminders:

- Any information that you use in your research that is **not your own, MUST be cited**.
- Even though you are citing your sources, you still need to **paraphrase** (put information into your own words).
- There is a certain format for citing your sources. It is called **MLA format** (Modern Language Association).
- If you copy and paste from a website directly into your report, or copy information word-for-word from a book, it is known as **plagiarism**.
- Be sure to use **accurate** and **reliable websites**.
