Parts of Book and Website Citations

<u>Author</u> – person who wrote the book/article

Title - name of the book/article

Place of Publication – place where the book/article is published

Publisher - company that publishes the book/article

Copyright Date – year the book/article is published

URL – Universal Resource Locator – website address

<u>Date of Access</u> – the date YOU accessed the web article

Nonfiction Books in the Library

- Nonfiction books in the library are shelved by order number according to the Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) System.
 - o Example:

510.9 SMI

- Nonfiction books are shelved from the **lowest number** to the **highest number**.
 - Example:

302.4 BAN 410.5 ARN

745.3 TOR 856.2 CAN 950.2 PER

- There is a certain format for citing your sources. It is called **MLA format** (Modern Language Association).
- If you copy and paste from a website directly into your report, or copy information word-for-word from a book, it is known as plagiarism.
- Be sure to use accurate and reliable websites.
